## Camp Details

For young men and women, the Youth Manufacturing Camp offers a unique opportunity to explore and discover high-wage careers in manufacturing. The program lets high school students and recent graduates “try on” a career through hands-on projects and learning experiences on the shop floor and college classroom. Participants will tour modern manufacturing facilities in their region, among other fun activities, to help them make career decisions.

In addition, the camp participants will “Earn While You Learn”. Stipends of up to \$300.00 can be earned for just for participating in the camp.

Manufacturing occupations include skilled jobs in machining, metal and plastic processing, computerized machine operations and programming, tool and die making, tool grinding, welding, automatic assembly, automation applications and many others. Camp participants will have an opportunity to see these occupations first hand, and experience what a career in manufacturing

The process doesn't stop when camp is done. Participants will also receive guidance on the resources and assistance they'll need to take the next steps in their career development through their local WorkOne office.

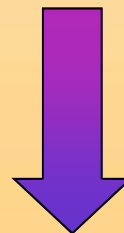

# Camp Information

## Dates for the 2009 Youth Manufacturing Camp

June 15 through June 26th—10 Day Camp

## Locations

The camp will be held in three locations: Indiana State University, Ivy Tech Community College of Indiana, and Terre Haute South High School. The final day will include tours of local manufacturing facilities.

## Groups

Students will be divided into three groups. Each group will rotate between the locations indicated above. Participants will be notified as to the site they will begin prior to the start date.

## Time

Each day will begin at 9 a.m. and the day will end at 3 p.m. There will be a one hour lunch break at noon.

## Cost

All activities of the Youth Manufacturing Camp—including lunch each day—are offered at no cost to eligible participants.

## Transportation

Limited funding for transportation to and from the camp locations may be available to eligible camp participants and will be based on where registered students reside.
